***INTRODUCTION TO HANDLING CATTLE
CLINIC
with Danielle Ternes***

About the Training

This clinic is for riders who wish to introduce their horses to cattle in a safe and controlled environment. Participants will first of all learn about techniques for giving their horse confidence around cattle and then get to move small groups of cattle, cut single animals out of a group, and more!

The focus will be on learning how cattle and horses respond to pressure, and how to use that knowledge to increase you and your horses' cattle working capabilities. No experience is necessary, the clinic will cater to all levels of participants.

The clinic will consist of a **3 hour session** with a maximum of **10 riders**.

Cost is **\$80** which includes arena/cow hire and instruction.
