For BRC & EA members ONLY

All riders of all levels are welcome to attend a 2-day clinic with Sarah Venamore. The only prerequisite is the ability to walk, trot and canter. All riders will benefit from Sarah's tuition on rhythm, looseness and straightness of the horse.

Each rider will receive 3 group lessons over the 2 days.

On Friday riders will receive 2 larger group lessons for 1 hour each; day two (Saturday) riders will break up into semi-private lessons (Max 3 riders – dependent on numbers) for 45 minutes.

\$200 for both days of the clinic. Please bring your own lunch & snacks.

Please tell us about your riding level/ability combination with your horse and/or if you can only get half a day off work on Friday.

Lessons will be in the sand dressage arenas at Bungendore Showground. You will be enthused and inspired and maybe a little tired all at the same time riding with Sarah. Your brain will be switched on!



Sarah is an EFA Coach Educator and NSW State Pony Club Dressage Coach with a unique talent for teaching group lessons where all levels of ability progress. She has published a number of books on arena exercises, which are treasured resources for many.

Sarah's commitment is to Passion, Growth and Devotion and she will help you with rhythm, looseness, contact, impulsion and the all-important straightness of the horse, which results

in a fabulous feel for the rider.

Please ensure that your gear/equipment/horse/pony is in good safe working order. If you are riding, you will be required to wear an approved riding helmet (ASNZS 3838) or other approved by the EA (Equestrian Australia) and appropriate clothing and footwear as set out in the Club's Code of Conduct. You are asked to disclose any medical conditions or allergies in order for BRC to provide the best assistance in the event of an incident.

BRC is an EA affiliated club and, as such, is covered by *Public Liability Insurance*. EA members are also covered under insurance whilst riding and training their horses. However, being a BRC member only does not mean that you are automatically covered under insurance. You should consider if holding your own personal accident or loss of income insurance is right for you.
