On Sunday 18th February 2007, 3 BRC riders competed in the Dressage competition hosted by Goulburn Dressage Club.

As BRC riders were getting ready for a fun day of flat riding, jumping and sporting, three of their club members were making their way to Goulburn to try their luck at the Goulburn Dressage Club's events.

Anne Field, Amy Bridgland and Tanya Morgan entered various tests which were ridden in what felt like knee deep sand arenas. I think we were all very lucky not to pull a tendon in the practice arena, which was very heavy.

Despite this Anne had a wonderful day winning the Novice 2.4 test and coming 2nd in both the Novice 2.2 and Prelim 1.4 tests. Amy placed 1st in Prep 1 and 3rd in Prelim 1.3, a fantastic effort on such a young horse! Tanya managed a 5th in the Prep 1 and 7th in Prelim 1.2 on a very non-compliant neddy.

The weather was perfect and Goulburn Dressage Club may well see more BRC members at their next outing. Those who attended would highly recommend it! Congratulations to BRC riders having such a successful day!!

Bungendore Riding Club Code of Conduct

- 1. Riders to wear approved AS/NZ 3838 helmet at all times whilst mounted. It must be structurally sound. Riders are encouraged to wear helmets at all other times when handling horses.
- 2. When riding in groups the rider of the horse following is responsible for keeping his/her horse at a safe distance from the horse in front. A horse known to kick should have a red ribbon on its tail.
- Suitable riding attire must be worn. It is recommended that riders wear full length trousers or jodhpurs and a sleeved shirt.
- 4. Suitable footwear which prevents the foot from sliding forward through the stirrup iron must be worn or caged stirrups must be used. Stirrups must be the correct size for the boot.
- 5. A first aid kit and communication link is to be available at Club activity days.
- 6. Dogs must be restrained and under control at all times.
- 7. The Committee reserves the right to ask members to remove a horse which is being disruptive or is not sufficiently under control.
- 8. Owners of stallions are to notify a Committee member that they are bringing a stallion to an activity day.
- 9. Members are not to engage in riding which will endanger themselves or others.
- Members should not be under the influence of alcohol or drugs prohibited by law during an activity day.
- 11. Horses must be in a condition fit to undertake the activities and riders are responsible for the condition and safety of their tack
- 12. Parents and carers must ensure children in their care are supervised and kept a safe distance from horses, vehicles and equipment.
- 13. Spectators should be at a safe distance from riding events.
- 14. Horse riding at Bungendore Riding Club activity days is restricted to financial members of the club or others who are otherwise covered by temporary insurance cover (eg. riders at ODE events)

On the weekend of the 10th & 11th March some of our BRC riders participated in the Bungendore Bush Bash Endurance Ride. The BRC riders were John Woods, Glenda Georges, Searl Johnston, Kristen Proudfoot, Kim Gaspari and myself. Unfortunately Helen Locke was not able to ride as her horse had an injury, although Helen along with Marion Kilby were helpers for the day.

The base camp was near the Gidleigh Woolshed, in a huge paddock with beautiful panoramic views across the hills, which were lovely and green after the early March rain. From the base camp we could see Bungendore and Lake George in the distance. Our first priority on arrival was to set up the horse yards. register and have our horses ready for a thorough vet check.

That evening all riders were able to listen to an information session about the 80k and 40k rides. The canteen served up some great meals - beef goulash. T bone steaks, hot chips, vegetables or salad. A "big breaky" was also available from the early hours of Sunday morning. Best of all, the old shearers quarters had been converted into a lovely dining room with large wooden tables and chairs and an open fire blazing in the evening and early morning.

On the Sunday morning the 80k riders set off at 6am and the 40k riders at 6.30am. I got off to a bad start as Nipper snapped his bridle just as we were about to start. I had to use bailing twine to hold the bridle together (this would never have passed pony club gear check!!!).

The ride started with a huge rocky hill, Woody and I were able to walk our horses over the rough ground and enjoy the spectacular views. As the ride continued we rode through paddocks, passed dams and through creeks. We rode according to the conditions, as the paddocks opened up we were able to trot for long distances and continue at a good steady pace. Our ride continued through many local properties including Gidleigh, Butmaroo and Lochart.

The finish line was at the base camp, all of our members completed the 40km ride, some faster than others but all of us within the maximum time. After the ride each competitor had 30 minutes to prepare their horse for another vet check. All riders used this time to sponge their horses and let them have something to eat and drink.

I have never participated in an endurance ride before; the Bungendore Bush Bash was a great opportunity to experience endurance riding locally. I thoroughly enjoyed the ride and would love to see it here again next year and would encourage anyone to give it a

Bungendore Riding Club Code of Conduct

- 1. Riders to wear approved AS/NZ 3838 helmet at all times whilst mounted. It must be structurally sound. Riders are encouraged to wear helmets at all other times when handling horses.
- 2. When riding in groups the rider of the horse following is responsible for keeping his/her horse at a safe distance from the horse in front. A horse known to kick should have a red ribbon on its tail.
- 3. Suitable riding attire must be worn. It is recommended that riders wear full length trousers or iodhpurs and a sleeved shirt.
- 4. Suitable footwear which prevents the foot from sliding forward through the stirrup iron must be worn or caged stirrups must be used. Stirrups must be the correct size for the boot.
- 5. A first aid kit and communication link is to be available at Club activity days.
- 6. Dogs must be restrained and under control at all times.
- 7. The Committee reserves the right to ask members to remove a horse which is being disruptive or is not sufficiently under control.
- 8. Owners of stallions are to notify a Committee member that they are bringing a stallion to an activity day.
- 9. Members are not to engage in riding which will endanger themselves or others.
- Members should not be under the influence of alcohol or drugs prohibited by law during an activity day.
- 11. Horses must be in a condition fit to undertake the activities and riders are responsible for the condition and safety of their tack
- 12. Parents and carers must ensure children in their care are supervised and kept a safe distance from horses, vehicles and equipment.
- 13. Spectators should be at a safe distance from riding events.
- 14. Horse riding at Bungendore Riding Club activity days is restricted to financial members of the club or others who are otherwise covered by temporary insurance cover (eg. riders at ODE events)



Bungendore Riding Club Code of Conduct

- 1. Riders to wear approved AS/NZ 3838 helmet at all times whilst mounted. It must be structurally sound. Riders are encouraged to wear helmets at all other times when handling horses.
- 2. When riding in groups the rider of the horse following is responsible for keeping his/her horse at a safe distance from the horse in front. A horse known to kick should have a red ribbon on its tail.
- 3. Suitable riding attire must be worn. It is recommended that riders wear full length trousers or jodhpurs and a sleeved shirt.
- 4. Suitable footwear which prevents the foot from sliding forward through the stirrup iron must be worn or caged stirrups must be used. Stirrups must be the correct size for the boot.
- 5. A first aid kit and communication link is to be available at Club activity days.
- 6. Dogs must be restrained and under control at all times.
- 7. The Committee reserves the right to ask members to remove a horse which is being disruptive or is not sufficiently under control.
- 8. Owners of stallions are to notify a Committee member that they are bringing a stallion to an activity day.
- 9. Members are not to engage in riding which will endanger themselves or others.
- 10. Members should not be under the influence of alcohol or drugs prohibited by law during an activity day.
- 11. Horses must be in a condition fit to undertake the activities and riders are responsible for the condition and safety of their tack
- 12. Parents and carers must ensure children in their care are supervised and kept a safe distance from horses, vehicles and equipment.
- 13. Spectators should be at a safe distance from riding events.
- 14. Horse riding at Bungendore Riding Club activity days is restricted to financial members of the club or others who are otherwise covered by temporary insurance cover (eg. riders at ODE events)
- 15. Pregnant riders should be aware of the benefits and risks associated with riding in this condition and must obtain and act upon professional medical advice regarding their fitness to continue participating in equine activities.



Report on MARC Showjumping and Dressage Competition

On Sunday the 20th May, 6 BRC members headed off for a fun day of Dressage and Show jumping at the lovely Murrumbateman Recreation Grounds. Ribbons were to 7th place and the BRC girls' managed to bring home a few. Thanks to Amy for coming along to video our events.

Dressage Results......

Prep 4

Tanya - her first comp on *Spur* came 3rd - went really well and he looked great!!! Helen L on *Orion* came 5th - they "flowed" beautifully!!

Marion on *Jeremy* didn't place this time but had another successful outing with him.

Test 1.1

Helen L on Orion 4th....Go Girl!!
Test 1.3

Kate S on Shallot - 7th - this was a large class - so did very well!!

Anna - her first comp on *Dan* didn't place but was really happy with his performance!!! **Test 2.3**

Kate S on Shallot - 4th place - ridden beautifully but Kate would have liked more time for prep/fitness prior to the event but was happy with the results!!!

Show jumping......

This was a really technical, tight and challenging course with 16 jumps in total. It was built on a slight slope so there were uphill and downhill approaches to jumps as well as flat. It was more like a "Horse Trial" course, as opposed to a straight show jumping course. Aside from the usual upright show jumps, the course included: White blocks, Brush side dressing, Fill/ Walls, Wooden Roll tops, "Pretend Water" (blue tarp underneath), 3 rail Fan, 2 Narrows - (that is half the width of a normal jump) - one had wings and then you had to do a tight 180 degree turn to the next one with NO wings - just on white blocks - very tricky!! It was as an exciting course!! 45cm Results

Anna on Dan – 5th place and that was with one refusal at the "Blue Wave" wall. Riders were challenged by the technicality of the course, not the height and there were very few clear rounds.

60cm Results

Anna on *Dan* was the only BRC member jumping this course. It was same design again - but they added more FILLS!! It was a very "busy" course!!! She ended up borrowing a crop from another rider, as thought that *Dan* would need more convincing on some"!! They had a rail down on No.3 and were going OK until No.6A.

Report on Canberra ODE

On the 2nd and 3rd of June, 3 BRC members ventured into Equestrian Park. Yarraluma to compete in the first ever "Newcomers" 60cm class hosted by NCHTA. BRC riders included: Allison Russell on Jay, Anna McAuliffe on Dan and Caroline Power riding two horses - her own, Fenton and a friends young fellow, Oscar. They all looked sooo lovely all plaited and dressed up!! Many thanks to Karen Yanik for going along as well as a non-rider to photograph the girls and upload onto Photobucket. It was perfect riding weather both days. The Saturday morning proved to be one of those gorgeous overcast misty mornings which had a real "calming" effect on the atmosphere of the Event. Perfect for riders preparing their horses for dressage. Alli was competing in her first ODE and did a lovely test to score 56% placing her 13th out of 20 competitors. It was Anna's first ODE on Dan and their test was pleasing but lost marks on accuracy scoring 49.5% putting them 17th after dressage. Caroline on Fenton was in the top ten after dressage and 20th on Oscar, noting - it was his first outing and he was a little stressed!! The poor boy!! As the riders hotted up for the Show jumping phase, so did the weather as the clouds cleared to produce a lovely sunny afternoon. The jumps were really spread out with nice, big flowing lines. The wings were very colourful with a variety of different styles which made many a horse take a second "look"!!

Alli went "clear" with only 3 time penalties moving her up to 9th before the XC phase and giving her a great chance of placing!

Anna went "clear" but had 24 time penalties and remained at 17th place. Caroline on Fenton went "clear" and had one refusal with "Oscar" and their placings didn't change.

That afternoon they all traveled home in anticipation of coming back the next morning for the Cross country!!

Sunday—The Cross Country phase!! Now for the real Buzz!! The ground was perfect due to recent rain and the "Newcomer" jumps weren't so "scary" as that's how its meant to be - to "encourage" riders/horses new to Eventing. The course included mostly logs, but also roll tops, ski, pipes, drop down, coils and through the water—no jump in/out!!

Bungendore Riding Club Code of Conduct

- 1. Riders to wear approved AS/NZ 3838 helmet at all times whilst mounted. It must be structurally sound. Riders are encouraged to wear helmets at all other times when handling horses.
- 2. When riding in groups the rider of the horse following is responsible for keeping his/her horse at a safe distance from the horse in front, A horse known to kick should have a red ribbon on its tail.
- 3. Suitable riding attire must be worn. It is recommended that riders wear full length trousers or iodhpurs and a sleeved shirt.
- 4. Suitable footwear which prevents the foot from sliding forward through the stirrup iron must be worn or caged stirrups must be used. Stirrups must be the correct size for the boot.
- 5. A first aid kit and communication link is to be available at Club activity days.
- Dogs must be restrained and under control at all times.
- 7. The Committee reserves the right to ask members to remove a horse which is being disruptive or is not sufficiently under control.
- 8. Owners of stallions are to notify a Committee member that they are bringing a stallion to an activity day.
- 9. Members are not to engage in riding which will endanger themselves or others.
- 10. Members should not be under the influence of alcohol or drugs prohibited by law during an activity dav.
- 11. Horses must be in a condition fit to undertake the activities and riders are responsible for the condition and safety of their tack
- 12. Parents and carers must ensure children in their care are supervised and kept a safe distance from horses, vehicles and equipment.
- 13. Spectators should be at a safe distance from riding events.
- 14. Horse riding at Bungendore Riding Club activity days is restricted to financial members of the club or others who are otherwise covered by temporary insurance cover (eg. riders at ODE events)
- 15. Pregnant riders should be aware of the benefits and risks associated with riding in this condition and must obtain and act upon professional medical advice regarding their fitness to continue participating in equine activities.

The In's n Outs of Dressage??

A dressage test is a test of your skill against another competitor's luck.

- * Dressage is about achieving a harmonious working relationship with your horse, whose only idea of harmony is eating grass in a field.
- * If you want to end a drought or dry spell, wear a new jacket and hat to an outdoor arena.
- * Untalented, difficult, aggressive horses have robust health and long lives.
- * Talented tractable horses are accident prone.
- * You will ride the best test of your entire life just prior to being disqualified for not wearing your gloves.
- * Horses do not improve their paces because you are wearing expensive German jodhpurs.
- * If you chose a disco theme for your dressage to music test then the judge will not be less than 90 years of age.
- * The less skilled the rider, the more likely they are to share their ideas and advice on riding a test.
- * If you are considering the services of a horse clairvoyant to help you with training then you have reached the point of total desperation - try the German jodhpurs instead.
- * If you fall off your horse in the arena you will have paid to have the test videoed.
- * If you are feeling confident before a Comp then three of the Australian team and one leading Eventer will turn up to give their young horses some "experience".
- * Your horse will perform its best piaffe ever when you ask for extended canter.
- * No one cheats at dressage because no one has worked out how
- * It is surprisingly easy to end a test with a perfect square halt once you have scored a four for every other movement.

Bungendore Riding Club Code of Conduct

- 1. Riders to wear approved AS/NZ 3838 helmet at all times whilst mounted. It must be structurally sound. Riders are encouraged to wear helmets at all other times when handling horses.
- 2. When riding in groups the rider of the horse following is responsible for keeping his/her horse at a safe distance from the horse in front. A horse known to kick should have a red ribbon on its tail.
- Suitable riding attire must be worn. It is recommended that riders wear full length trousers or jodhpurs and a sleeved shirt.
- 4. Suitable footwear which prevents the foot from sliding forward through the stirrup iron must be worn or caged stirrups must be used. Stirrups must be the correct size for the boot.
- 5. A first aid kit and communication link is to be available at Club activity days.
- 6. Dogs must be restrained and under control at all times.
- 7. The Committee reserves the right to ask members to remove a horse which is being disruptive or is not sufficiently under control.
- 8. Owners of stallions are to notify a Committee member that they are bringing a stallion to an activity day.
- 9. Members are not to engage in riding which will endanger themselves or others.
- Members should not be under the influence of alcohol or drugs prohibited by law during an activity day.
- 11. Horses must be in a condition fit to undertake the activities and riders are responsible for the condition and safety of their tack
- 12. Parents and carers must ensure children in their care are supervised and kept a safe distance from horses, vehicles and equipment.
- 13. Spectators should be at a safe distance from riding events.
- 14. Horse riding at Bungendore Riding Club activity days is restricted to financial members of the club or others who are otherwise covered by temporary insurance cover (eg. riders at ODE events)
- 15. Pregnant riders should be aware of the benefits and risks associated with riding in this condition and must obtain and act upon professional medical advice regarding their fitness to continue participating in equine activities.

PREPARATION FOR COMPETITION

(the practicalities of getting to and surviving your first showjumping event)

Before you even start thinking about entering a competition, most club and agricultural show equestrian events now require membership of the club or the EFA before you can compete due to insurance reasons. Without EFA membership of both horse and rider, many shows won't accept entries even to non-official classes. Make sure you organise this well in advance.

Next, make sure you have safe and reliable transport for your horse. If you don't have your own float or truck, you will need to organise to hire one, perhaps with a driver if you don't have a truck licence or a car that can legally tow a float. Getting together with a group of friends to hire a truck with driver is often a cost-effective and safe option.

Of course, unless your horse will calmly and quickly load on to a float or truck, all your preparation will be wasted. Don't wait until the day of the event to find out your horse won't load. You need to have prepared and practiced weeks in advance to make sure you don't spend fruitless hours trying to load your horse on the morning of the event.

Make sure your horse will tie up to the side of the float or truck. Many showgrounds don't have yards available. Nothing is more annoying than chasing your horse around the competition ground when you want to be concentrating on walking the next course. Tying up a hay-net to keep your horse occupied and settled can help.

It is said that the most amazing thing about commonsense is that it isn't very common. How often have you seen a horse tied to a float with the towing vehicle removed? When a horse pulls back and takes the float with it, it's a potential disaster for everyone on the showground. Don't use expensive headstalls or lead ropes until you know your horse is calm and so-cialised enough not to break it. Learn how to tie a quick release knot - this could stop your horse strangling itself.

Get the schedule of classes early to make sure you are eligible for the classes you wish to start in, i.e. official or otherwise, and that you turn up in plenty of time. Factor in a slow and careful drive to the showground and time to find a good park, unload and settle your horse, queue up to enter your classes, groom and saddle up, and walk the course.

Arriving early will help you find a comfortable place to park - look for shade, access to water, and electricity if you need it. Getting there early also gives your horse (and you) time to get familiar with the surroundings and ideally for you to lead or ride him around to show him anything that you feel may worry him.

An EFA rule book will not only tell you the scoring system for various types of competitions but also the way they are run, for example, straight against the clock immediately after a clear round or a raising of fences then a jump off. As a first timer, it's a good idea to check out the book as this knowledge is usually assumed by event organisers.

If possible, walk the course twice, checking the line you will ride and distances between fences. Either walk by yourself (not with friends who may distract you) or with a mentor who can help you with distances and any difficulties in the course. Remember to decide from which direction you are going to approach the start pegs, and where you will ride to and slow down after the finish pegs.

It's normal to be nervous, particularly when getting started. Try to rely on a preparation technique, suppling exercises or a workout that will help take you and your horse get your minds off your nerves.

Only experience will tell you how much warming up your horse needs to be settled and listening before the class. Some horses only need 10-15 minutes warm up and a few practice fences; some nervous horses may need more time spent on exercises to get them focused on you and not the excitement around them.

When going into the marshalling yard to ride the practice fences, try to take a friend that will make the adjustments to the fences that you need. Don't be intimidated into letting someone else control the practice fences. Make sure you are clear which direction you should be jumping the fences otherwise you could cause an accident. Don't overdo the practice fences. If your horse jumps the first few well, leave them.

When the marshal directs you to enter the ring, you must approach the judge and state your and/or your horse's name. Once acknowledged, you can move off and begin riding around the ring but remember not to start the course until you hear the bell or horn.

September!! Jump for Joy!

Many thanks to all members who attended the Jump working bee. Many hands made it a quick and easy job!! Our region is still El free. Please take care and follow strict Bio-security measures!!! BRC recommends to minimise movement of horses regardless of now being able to apply for a permit. Take advantage of this EVENT free time!!! Think about it?? No early morning rises, rushing here and there!! No increased blood pressure after discovering you have forgotten your bridle!!! Relax, sit back and have a second cuppa!!! ...if the view is of your horse, even better!! Maybe use this time as an opportunity to do some of the things that you wouldn't normally do with your Neddy. Perhaps spend time just hanging out together. A good groom &/or massage might be on the cards?? Maybe "play" some games and/or work on the ground skills you have been "meaning to get to". Head shy - difficult to bridle or drench?? Work on these!! Picking up feet, leading, lunging, clipping, float loading?? There's plenty of great resources on the internet on the "how to" or ask a friend for help!!! Don't feel flat about flatwork!!. If you are getting bored with riding in circles, why not include some serpentines, add in some ground poles and cones. Set up patterns, change transitions and direction often. Keep them "guessing"!! Work on getting your Neddy "bending", supple and yielding!!Make an obstacle course and use the "approach/retreat" technique to work with tarps, plastic bags, bunting, balloons, umbrellas etcall the things that you wouldn't normally do....have a FUN time with your horse!!! OR alternatively you could turn "Neddy" out and take up bird watching, cycling, boot scooting or sky diving!!

BRC recommends to minimise movement and avoid gatherings of horses. Move off property only if absolutely necessary!!!

As of Friday the 21st of September 2007, riders and horse owners residing in the NSW Green zone are allowed movement within this zone. If you plan to float and/or ride off your property, you must obtain a "Travelling Horse Statement" from the DPI. This form must be signed, dated and carried with you whilst in transit. You must do a NEW permit for every ride and trip off your property; and each form must be retained as a record for 7 weeks after use.

BRC has decided to follow the lead of NSW Pony Club Association and NOT hold any ridden Events at this stage due to a NEW isolated outbreak at "nearby" Campbelltown - the "source" was believed to be spread by humans not horses.

- * No one can guarantee that they or their horses' are "clean".
- * BRC does not wish to be responsible if the "source" of an outbreak in our region was due to the club holding an event.
- * All horses' health in our region is No.1 priority and we're all responsible for minimising any chance of an outbreak here.
- * Many owners have older horses that if they were to become infected may lead to death of the horse.
- * BRC shares the Showground facilities with other clubs and it should be maintained as a "clean" area.
- * Now that horse owners in the Green Zone have "permission" to move around if necessary, it would be in everyone's best interest to take measures to ensure that this status remains.
- * NSW horse owners are NOT permitted to move their horse or float into the ACT including crossing over the border along roads such as the Kings H'way and Sutton Rd. Heavy fines can be enforced.

Bungendore Riding Club Code of Conduct

- 1. Riders to wear approved AS/NZ 3838 helmet at all times whilst mounted. It must be structurally sound. Riders are encouraged to wear helmets at all other times when handling horses.
- 2. When riding in groups the rider of the horse following is responsible for keeping his/her horse at a safe distance from the horse in front. A horse known to kick should have a red ribbon on its tail.
- Suitable riding attire must be worn. It is recommended that riders wear full length trousers or jodhpurs and a sleeved shirt.
- 4. Suitable footwear which prevents the foot from sliding forward through the stirrup iron must be worn or caged stirrups must be used. Stirrups must be the correct size for the boot.
- 5. A first aid kit and communication link is to be available at Club activity days.
- 6. Dogs must be restrained and under control at all times.
- 7. The Committee reserves the right to ask members to remove a horse which is being disruptive or is not sufficiently under control.
- 8. Owners of stallions are to notify a Committee member that they are bringing a stallion to an activity day.
- 9. Members are not to engage in riding which will endanger themselves or others.
- 10. Members should not be under the influence of alcohol or drugs prohibited by law during an activity day.
- 11. Horses must be in a condition fit to undertake the activities and riders are responsible for the condition and safety of their tack
- 12. Parents and carers must ensure children in their care are supervised and kept a safe distance from horses, vehicles and equipment.
- 13. Spectators should be at a safe distance from riding events.
- 14. Horse riding at Bungendore Riding Club activity days is restricted to financial members of the club or others who are otherwise covered by temporary insurance cover (eq. riders at ODE events)
- 15. Pregnant riders should be aware of the benefits and risks associated with riding in this condition and must obtain and act upon professional medical advice regarding their fitness to continue participating in equine activities.

October Activity Day—Rose Walker— Dressage Demonstration 28th October 2007

Who said El meant we couldn't get our horsey fix? This was a fabulous day with 20 members and helpers at Tanya's place in Wamboin to enjoy a dressage demonstration by the very talented Rosalie Walker. Talk about 4 seasons in one day! The morning proved quite windy but this didn't deter either horse or rider. Despite a broken wrist, Rose began by riding her beautiful "Medium" (training Advanced) mount, Argentille Gerard or "Radi" as he is affectionately known. Radi is a 12 year old Arabian Warmblood whose Sire is Argentille Gullit, an imported Stallion from Holland. Rose & Radi demonstrated a variety of Advanced level movements with Rose describing how each are achieved. These included half pass, shoulder in, travers, half pirouette, extensions & flying changes, the latter of which were just superb to watch. Rose explained how various parts of the rider's body are used to achieve these movements & spoke of the need to have a happy horse who was engaged in the hind quarters through the use of leg & seat aids. She also clearly demonstrated the difference between a "working" gait and "collected" gait which was fantastic to watch. There's hope for us all yet! Next to perform was Tammy Norwood on her gorgeous three year old warmblood Tarobri Alcorin or "Meldrum". Rose had planned to ride Meldrum but with the wrist injury she felt it might be a big ask on this huge fellow who stands a statuesque 17 HH. Meldrum's sire is J.B. Alabaster. Tammy purchased the mare in foal with Meldrum and has had him in training with Rose for the past 8 months. To watch this baby float around the arena was just stunning. Given the size of the horse he is surprisingly light on his feet. Rose commentated whilst Tammy rode various movements used to train such a young mount. Rose stressed the importance of getting basic lateral movements correct in order to achieve the higher level movements like half pass later in training. After the demo it started to rain, but members had already gathered inside to enjoy a sip of champagne to celebrate Tanya's birthday before sitting down to a scrumptious lunch prepared by our able caterer. Helen Blain. Young Hannah Allan attended to member's goodies on the BBQ whilst others mingled inside with Carol Dawson from Country Park Animal Herb to chat about her products & horse health in general. Carol surprised the club by presenting a beautiful basket of goodies which was won by Tammy Norwood as a lucky door prize. Carol also supplied samples of her products for members. Perspectives on Equine Influenza by Jack Laing

There is a huge amount of information circulating on the current situation, and an even bigger amount of misinformation. Be careful of what you believe. I would suggest the best place to start is:

www.dpi.nsw.qov.au/equine-influenza It is current and correct.



Firstly let's emphasize - If you suspect your horse is infected with El you MUST legally notify NSW DPI on the El hotline 1800 675 888.

This disease is so contagious that you won't be keeping it secret for long. We are very lucky to be in a green zone which allows horses to move within the zone provided you carry a Transported Horse Statement (available on the DPI website).

Horses cannot enter the green zone from another zone. People visiting from another zone must be particularly careful with their biosecurity - this is the most likely way the disease will spread. It depends on each of us to be aware of this and not allow any slip-ups to occur.

Events may be held in the green zone provided they are registered with the DPI and the horses have transported horse statements. Chilled semen can be moved within NSW without restriction. Farriers, vets and trainers may move without restriction within the green zone.

I believe that the containment strategy has worked very well so far, and should result in the elimination of the disease. This may take more time than everyone wants, but is much better than having endemic El. We must continue to be vigilant and cooperative.

Containment and good biosecurity continue to be more important than vaccination, which is a distraction to the main game and not the silver bullet that some people think it is. Strategic vaccination in buffer zones is part of the plan, whereas general vaccination may not be of much use. Politics and pressure are playing a part.

Infighting between various horse groups is also not helping. Racing groups may have more political influence but in the end we sink or swim together, and all efforts should aim towards our common goal of regaining El free status. The horse industry on the whole should be proud to have achieved containment as well as it has done. The DPI should also be congratulated. We should remember that the person who has never made a mistake has probably never done anything either!

Enough sermonizing - the success of all of this depends on people doing the right thing. Use the DPI website as your first point of call, and please call our surgery if you have any questions.

Bungendore Riding Club Code of Conduct

- 1. Riders must wear approved AS/NZ 3838 or EFA approved helmet at all times whilst mounted. It must be structurally sound. Riders are encouraged to wear helmets at all other times when handling horses.
- 2. When riding in groups the rider of the horse following is responsible for keeping his/her horse at a safe distance from the horse in front. A horse known to kick should have a red ribbon in its tail.
- 3. Suitable riding attire must be worn. It is recommended that riders wear full length trousers or jodhpurs and a sleeved shirt.
- 4. Suitable footwear which prevents the foot from sliding forward through the stirrup iron must be worn or caged stirrups must be used. Stirrups must be the correct size for the boot.
- 5. A first aid kit and communication link is to be available at Club activity days.
- 6. Dogs must be restrained and under control at all times.
- BRC Committee reserves the right to ask members to remove a horse which is being disruptive or is not sufficiently under control.
- 8. Owners of stallions are to notify a Committee member that they are bringing a stallion to an activity day.
- 9. Members are not to engage in riding which will endanger themselves or others. Riders must consult other riders before increasing pace and/or distance from the group on trail rides.
- 10. Members should not be under the influence of alcohol or drugs prohibited by law during an activity day.
- 11. Horses must be in a condition fit to undertake the activities and riders are responsible for the condition and safety of their tack
- 12. Parents and carers must ensure children in their care are supervised and kept a safe distance from horses, vehicles and equipment.
- 13. Spectators should be at a safe distance from riding events.
- 14. Horse riding at Bungendore Riding Club activity days is restricted to financial members of the club or others who are otherwise covered by temporary insurance cover (e.g. riders at ODE events)
- 15. Pregnant riders should be aware of the benefits and risks associated with riding in this condition and must obtain and act upon professional medical advice regarding their fitness to continue participating in equine activities.
- 16. Members are to participate in a polite, honest and respectful manner in dealings with fellow members, officials and others associated with BRC. Inappropriate behaviour and/or abusive language will not be tolerated. Members must accept responsibility for their actions.
- 17. Members are to follow the procedures set down by the BRC Event Organisers including making payments on time/by the due date as required.
- 18. Members are to act in accordance to the BRC Code of Conduct. The committee reserves the right to refuse participation of members in breach of the BRC Code of Conduct.
