Show jumping training

About Margaret – Margaret is a CCI-S/L 3* rider and Level 1 EA coach, based in Bungendore, NSW. She has been a member of the Equestrian Australia Youth Development Squad and competes throughout NSW and Victoria.

She has worked with green thoroughbreds to upper level dressage, show jumping and eventing horses, and everything in between; as well as training with top riders and coaches like Ben Netterfield and Sam Lyle.



Margaret has coached adults and children of all levels, and takes a logical, problem-solving based approach to riding and training.

About the Training –

Margaret will be schooling groups (maximum of 4 riders) around a showjumping course. Each group session will be for approximately 90 minutes and will be offered at various heights from 30cm to 80cm.

About Leanne - Leanne is a Level 1 EA Coach, based in Wamboin. She has an Associate Diploma in Horse Management from Orange Agricultural College and spent time in Holland grooming for a Grand Prix dressage rider after College. She has since brought on her own horses, from starting them herself to competing at various levels over the years.

Leanne teaches all ages and particularly enjoys working with riders and horses to achieve a more harmonious and confident partnership.

Leanne will be focusing on rider position and suppling exercises for horses in small groups (maximum of 4 riders). Each group session will be for approximately 90 minutes and will be offered at various levels from Introductory to Novice.
