How to Prepare for STARCC 2009

You may not know this, but there's more to hacking classes than just merely looking good! Read on for an insight into the world of hack classes and what to expect in some of the classes at STARCC. (Note: Prep/beginner riders will not be expected to canter or hand gallop.)

For all of the classes, horses should be presented neatly as hacks or hunters (hunters don't wear blingy browbands and usually have neat "workmanlike" gear).

These classes will be judged on performance rather then type to encourage everyone to compete, this is not just for the "hackie" type riders.

As STARCC is an inter-club competition, riders should compete in their club uniform rather than dragging out their hacking gear.

Hacking Terminology

Working Hunter - a horse of substance who is capable of hunting. Judged over jumps as well as on the flat. Obedience is important. The odd scar or bump does not go against these horses. We will ask judges on the day to take into account the requirements above regarding the heaviness of the horse might be overlooked as we have not provided a regular hack class as we wanted to make all the classes more performance oriented, not type oriented. Horses should be capable of a hand gallop.

Show Hunter - as above without the jumps.

Bridle Path Hack - this is a rail class. Horses need to work calmly "on the rail" and perform a change of direction and a rein back. Horses will be judged on obedience.

Pleasure Hack - horse to be ridden one handed in a snaffle type bit, no drop nosebands, no spurs or whips. At the discretion of the judge, a workout may or may not be required. Horses should be a pleasure to ride. Rein back and changes of pace and direction are often asked on the ring by the judge. Canter to halt can be asked for.

ARC Mount - a horse suitable for ARC - sound, reliable and obedient. Well presented and conditioned, judged like PC hack but for adults, a small jump or obstacle might be used by some judges.

Best Educated Mount- horse's level of education is judged. Horses should be able to rein back, make good changes (preferably flying) demonstrate lengthened trot and hand gallop or canter and turns on hind or forehand. Judges sometimes give a "free" workout for this only describing the requirements they wish to see.

Bungendore Riding Club Code of Conduct

- 1. Horse riding at Bungendore Riding Club activity days is restricted to financial members of the club or others who are otherwise covered by temporary insurance cover (e.g riders at ODE events)
- 2. Members are to follow the procedures set down by the BRC Event Organisers including making payments on time/by the due date as required.
- 3. Riders must wear approved AS/NZ 3838 or EFA approved helmet at all times whilst mounted. It must be structurally sound. Riders are encouraged to wear helmets at all other times when handling horses.
- 4. Suitable footwear which prevents the foot from sliding forward through the stirrup iron must be worn or caged stirrups must be used. Stirrups must be the correct size for the boot.
- 5. Suitable riding attire must be worn. It is recommended that riders wear full length trousers or jodhpurs and a sleeved shirt.
- 6. A first aid kit and communication link is to be available at Club activity days.
- 7. Members should not be under the influence of alcohol or drugs prohibited by law during an activity day.
- 8. Pregnant riders should be aware of the benefits and risks associated with riding in this condition and must obtain and act upon professional medical advice regarding their fitness to continue participating in equine activities.
- 9. Members are to participate in a polite, honest and respectful manner in dealings with fellow members, officials and others associated with BRC. Inappropriate behaviour and/or abusive language will not be tolerated. Members must accept responsibility for their actions.
- 10. Members are not to engage in riding which will endanger themselves or others. Riders must consult other riders before increasing pace and/or distance from the group on trail rides and other group activities.
- 11. When riding in groups the rider of the horse following is responsible for keeping his/her horse at a safe distance from the horse in front. A horse known to kick should have a red ribbon in its tail.
- 12. Horses must be in a condition fit to undertake the activities and riders are responsible for the condition and
- 13. Owners of stallions are to notify a Committee member that they are bringing a stallion to an activity day.
- 14. BRC Committee reserves the right to ask members to remove a horse which is being disruptive or is not sufficiently under control.
- 15. Dogs must be restrained and under control at all times.
- 16. Spectators should be at a safe distance from riding events.
- 17. Parents and carers must ensure children in their care are supervised and kept a safe distance from horses. vehicles and equipment.
- 18, Members are to act in accordance to the BRC Code of Conduct. The committee reserves the right to refuse participation of members in breach of the BRC Code of Conduct.


58 horses and riders from Bungendore (BRC), Murrumbateman (MARC) and Tuggeranong (TARC) riding clubs, as well as a small number from National Capital Equestrian Club (NCEC) turned out for a the beautiful sunny day to put their hacking, dressage and sporting skills to the test. 15 members from Bungendore proudly represented our club. Competitors had the choice of entering one of three levels of difficulty, all including hacking and hunter classes, a dressage test and sporting events. The class that made this competition slightly different from other comps was the 'Handy Horse'. Riders had to take their horse over a timed course which included weaving through a grid, riding through cones, a few jumps and other 'unfamiliar' obstacles. Every rider had lots of fun with this event and it was a great one for spectators as well. MARC proved too good on the day and won the STARCC trophy with 32 points, TARC coming in second with 23 and BRC hot on their tails with 22. The 'Best on Parade' was won by TARC who were awarded a newly donated perpetual Trophy. BRC looked pretty flash, especially with the addition of our little mascot, Madeline who was very cute and we came third.

BRC riders had an excellent day with everyone having fun and also taking home quite a few ribbons. A few who did very well on the day have shared their results for the newsletter.

Sporting

Bec Purdie and Amanda Blandon were the sporting stars with both winning first in their respective sections in bending and barrelling. Amanda also won her egg and spoon and walk, trot, lead. - 10. Members are not to engage in riding which will endanger themselves or others. Riders must consult other riders before increasing pace and/or distance from the group on trail rides and other group activities.
- 11. When riding in groups the rider of the horse following is responsible for keeping his/her horse at a safe distance from the horse in front. A horse known to kick should have a red ribbon in its tail.
- 12. Horses must be in a condition fit to undertake the activities and riders are responsible for the condition and safety of their tack
- 13. Owners of stallions are to notify a Committee member that they are bringing a stallion to an activity day.
- 14. BRC Committee reserves the right to ask members to remove a horse which is being disruptive or is not sufficiently under control.
- 15. Dogs must be restrained and under control at all times.
- 16. Spectators should be at a safe distance from riding events.
- 17. Parents and carers must ensure children in their care are supervised and kept a safe distance from horses, vehicles and equipment.
- 18. Members are to act in accordance to the BRC Code of Conduct. The committee reserves the right to refuse participation of members in breach of the BRC Code of Conduct.

Bungendore Riding Club Code of Conduct

- 1. Horse riding at Bungendore Riding Club activity days is restricted to financial members of the club or others who are otherwise covered by temporary insurance cover (e.g riders at ODE events)
- 2. Members are to follow the procedures set down by the BRC Event Organisers including making payments on time/by the due date as required.
- 3. Riders must wear approved AS/NZ 3838 or EFA approved helmet at all times whilst mounted. It must be structurally sound. Riders are encouraged to wear helmets at all other times when handling horses.
- 4. Suitable footwear which prevents the foot from sliding forward through the stirrup iron must be worn or caged stirrups must be used. Stirrups must be the correct size for the boot.
- 5. Suitable riding attire must be worn. It is recommended that riders wear full length trousers or jodhpurs and a sleeved shirt.
- 6. A first aid kit and communication link is to be available at Club activity days.
- 7. Members should not be under the influence of alcohol or drugs prohibited by law during an activity day.
- 8. Pregnant riders should be aware of the benefits and risks associated with riding in this condition and must obtain and act upon professional medical advice regarding their fitness to continue participating in equine activities.
- 9. Members are to participate in a polite, honest and respectful manner in dealings with fellow members, officials and others associated with BRC. Inappropriate behaviour and/or abusive language will not be tolerated. Members must accept responsibility for their actions.







Annual Cathcart Trail Ride May 2009

Scott and I participated in the Annual Cathcart Trail ride this year.

Cathcart is a tiny village near Bombala, nestled below the Snowy Mountains. Each year they run the Cathcart Charity Trail Ride and this year there were 83 riders (ranging from age 9 to around 80) plus various support crew in the village for the event. Scott and I travelled in convoy with a group of friends, arriving the afternoon before the ride, giving us time to settle the horses in and meet fellow riders. After over a week of horrible weather here (such as the weekend before that resulted in the jumping clinic being cancelled) I was more than a little concerned about how cold it would be. The God's blessed us and we woke to a chilly but still, clear day. We were up early to make the 6:00am HUGE country style cooked breakfast - the perfect way to start a long day. Not too long for chatting as we were back to getting the horses saddled up for our 7:30am start - Scott was riding Scream and I was on my new, young horse Buddy (who had only ever seen a race track and a sand arena previously to this ride). Buddy was very excited to see all the horses and we spent the first half of the day jogging and prancing around - but overall, he did very well considering it was such a strange, new environment for him. He got edgy when he couldn't see any of the horses he knew (yes, we will need to work on this), but once he was next to one of them, he relaxed and was happy to stretch his neck out and walk on a loose rein.

Our first river crossing (Coolumbooka River) came up pretty quickly and luckily for me, Buddy was halfway through before he realised he was in the water (I kept him close up the back of Scream so he didn't realise he was going into water). He jumped out the other side – but was really pretty well behaved and crossed the river many more times during the ride without issue. Some horses (and riders) had hesitations with the water but we all made it through in one form another. We headed through some steep forest trails before coming back onto the plains near the river for a fantastic morning tea – imagine a chilly few hours of riding, then stopping in a





picturesque valley with tables laid out with all the cakes, pastries, slices and hot foods you could imagine - Yummo! It was so well organised, they even placed very respectable toilets with real toilet paper out for us. We headed off again through a mixture of valleys and steep forested hills and arrived at lunch by the river even more amazing food including salad wraps, BBQ and steaming hot soup (and lots more cakes and biscuits). After lunch it was back through the river and up some pretty steep hills. In all, we travelled nearly 40Kms of some really pretty countryside. The organisation was fantastic and we were flanked by "marshals" the whole ride, helping some of the less experienced riders through some difficult areas - but generally, happy to have a chat and find out where you came from, what you do, etc. Just as our butts were saying "no more" we came down the last hill to cross the final river crossing before we returned to the village around 4:00pm. The day finished with a spectacular deep water crash in the river by one of the riders who thought it would be smart to canter along the centre of the river rather than just crossing it like everyone else! After having a quick (but hot) shower and feeding the horses, we returned to the hall for another amazing meal, followed by "DJ Dave's" disco. There was lots of chatting and drinking by the many fires outside but we all crashed pretty early after such a long day. We were back for another huge cooked breakfast the following morning before we packed up to head home. I really recommend this event to everyone - families and singles alike. All the riders and volunteers were so friendly and I can't speak highly enough about how well organised the whole event was (and it was really well priced as well).

Versatile Horse of the Year Competition hosted by TARC Equestrian Park, Yarralumla 14th June 2009

Wow! This was a fun but very challenging Event - with all of us trying to "remember" everything for the different workouts, Dressage (DR) and other events. It was also physically challenging (especially for someone like me), to remain "clean"!?! Dan "snotted" on the back of my Jacket and then I sat in "something" in my "clean" jods, ... and I somehow got "stuff" on my front as well?!Guess I'm not cut out to be an "Hackie"?!Anyway...It was a very well organised event and I don't know how they managed to coordinate such an amazing Draw for the day to run so smoothly, an absolute credit to TARC!!

There were 4 Classes increasing in the level of difficulty and ability.

- 1. Preparatory DR & Cross rails SJ,
- 2. Preliminary DR & 45cm SJ,
- 3. Novice DR & 60cm SJ and
- 4. Elementary DR and 80cm SJ.

The Hacking events were based on the level of dressage entered. Each class had six events, but you were only required to complete 4 events for a final score. The events included a Led workout, a Hack workout, Dressage test, Handy horse, Sporting and Showjumping. I decided to enter the "Novice" class with 60cm SJ as I wanted to keep our jumping momentum going for Canberra ODE which was the following weekend. But the novice dressage test 2.3 was beyond my level of experience but thought to give it a go?! Our practice at home and warm up on the day wasn't too bad, considering my lack of experience, and we were doing correct canter leads etc and relatively "accurate" - Oh! and I was coping with the "sitting trot"!; so I was thinking that we would get round more or less okay?!.... Well, if there had of been a prize for "how NOT to ride the 2.3, then we would have won hands down! We totally topped in all aspects of the "incorrect" - we had no "frame" the whole time -"above bit", bending out from the arena pipes, wobbly, crooked, hollow in back, off centre line, circles too big, no length shown, and usually our best moves - wrong canter leads both ways, with the second one to be topped off by going "disunited"! (good one!!)... It was such a disaster and I think that the Judge was mortified by our "un"performance?!!!!

The Showjumping was a nice course (thanks to Forest Park Riding school) - the Ring was smaller than usual (due to fitting in all the other events as part of the grounds are closed off in preparation for the construction of new Dressage arenas). Anyway, the jumps were "flowing" with lots of change of rein.

It was a fun course and we did a nice round, except I rode crooked into, unrelated No.7 to "pull the rail"; costing me 2nd place as we were 1 second off Optimum time! But that didn't really bother me as such, I was more happy with how well Dan went round - smoothly and without being silly.

The Handy Horse event was disappointing for my "level" as the course didn't really "measure" how handy a horse could be. It was based on fastest time had a key hole, then couple little jumps (which could be stepped over), bending around cones, through an S bend (poles on ground), over some trot poles, round some trees, to finish through a pole laneway. I was expecting to be asked to "back up", carry items and walk a tarp/carpet maybe?

The Novice hack workout was fun and a challenge to fit the workout inside the small area, and I was happy with our accuracy for the canter "serpentine with "2 different changes"; (correct leads this time!) and even though we didn't achieve any "extension" in our trot, it was a huge improvement on our dressage.

The other events included the Led workout; and Sporting - which involved the bending and barrel races timed all in one go and that was a bit of fun being a bit "uncouth", and guess it would have looked slightly funny to see all these riders in "Hack attire" hooning around barrels!

My results in Novice class—Led - 10th, Hack - 12th, Showjumping - 11th, Handy horse 8th, Sporting - 8th and Dressage—am pretty sure we would have come last with an impressive 42%!!! It was a fun day, but guess I won't be attempting another novice DR test for a long time!

Caryn, Megan and myself ventured into Equestrian Park for an exciting 2 days of Eventing. We got to see some of the "Pro's" riding their magnificent horses in between riding our own events. We were all entered in the Newcomers class which included Dressage test 1.1 (thats more like it!), 60cm Showjumping and 60cm Cross country. Newcomers is a class designed to introduce and/or build confidence in you and your horse for the 3 phases of Eventing. Results are based on a penalty system with the lowest number of penalties after all 3 phases wins. Your Dressage % score is converted to penalties.

For Megan, it was her "baby's" first ODE!? He is only 4 years and has been broken in about 7months! It was also Caryn's first official ODE and 2nd ODE on her lovely mare, Portia. For me, having done a number of NC's over the last 3 years (take out the El break) on Dan; I'm still in the process of re-building his confidence after previous owner issues! I am hopeful though, that we will one day eventually move onto the next level, Introductory.

Day One:

Dressage. Megan attained a great result, considering that the warm up area was near 600m from the actual arena; and after conversion was on 56.20 penalties. Caryn was on 63.12 achieving their best DR test to date, and myself not far behind, on 64.38. We went so much better compared to last weekend's disaster at VHOTY!

Showjumping. The course was "inviting" for green horses but a lot of the course was built down and many of the jumps were only 45cm. This proved the undoing for many of the "big" horses who lazily pulled rail after rail. No.7 Oxer on a slight downhill slope also proved to cause a lot of trouble including lots of refusals. Megan was very proud of her boy doing an easy clear round as per Caryn who also went clear. Whilst I also managed a clear round as well, it wasn't as nice as the last few rounds we have done recently. Dan slightly reverted back to some of his previous "silly" behaviour, but it was very minor and nothing compared to "Canberra 2007" where we "found our line" into the first jump more or less sideways!!!

There were 31 competitors in our class and after the first 2 Phases, Megan was coming about 15th, and Caryn and I were around 20-22nd mark.

Day Two:

Cross Country. Equestrian park received a huge dumping of rain overnight and it was a bit of a concern that the XC course would be really slippery? A course walk, saw only a couple parts to 'err on the side of caution' and in actual fact, it was really good under foot.

Jump one was a lovely, newly constructed box/ski with concrete pillars as wings; but quite a "scary" and confronting looking jump for the first one "on course" and proved for many refusals especially the "green" horses. The course also included logs, roll tops, skis, drop off, ditch, pipes, water and another newly constructed box jump to finish. Megan's boy was very brave and did a clear XC round; but racked up time penalties, due to Megan taking her time with such a young fellow to finish in 23rd place on 95.85 penalties. Caryn also took her time and was a little cautious with the downhill jumping, but unfortunately ended up with 3 refusals to be eliminated. Dan slightly hesitated into the new jump number 1 and number 2 raised spotted log, and but then set off at a nice cracking pace, woohoo!!!....Until, into the pines, Jump 5, an easy roll top, but had hay bales added to create "wings", which "surprised" Dan, for a refusa!! Doh! But for the rest of the course, he didn't "bat an eye" to jump clear, confident and at a good pace - for only 6 time penalties considering slowing for wet parts and the stop, I was pleased with his efforts, and finished 19th with 91.18 penalties.

It was a great event and NCHTA is to be congratulated especially for the enormous preparation they put into the lovely Equestrian park Cross country course!

- 3. Riders must wear approved AS/NZ 3838 or EFA approved helmet at all times whilst mounted. It must be structurally sound. Riders are encouraged to wear helmets at all other times when handling horses.
- 4. Suitable footwear which prevents the foot from sliding forward through the stirrup iron must be worn or caged stirrups must be used. Stirrups must be the correct size for the boot.
- Suitable riding attire must be worn. It is recommended that riders wear full length trousers or jodhpurs and a sleeved shirt.
- 6. A first aid kit and communication link is to be available at Club activity days.
- 7. Members should not be under the influence of alcohol or drugs prohibited by law during an activity day.
- 8. Pregnant riders should be aware of the benefits and risks associated with riding in this condition and must obtain and act upon professional medical advice regarding their fitness to continue participating in equine activities.
- 9. Members are to participate in a polite, honest and respectful manner in dealings with fellow members, officials and others associated with BRC. Inappropriate behaviour and/or abusive language will not be tolerated. Members must accept responsibility for their actions.
- 10. Members are not to engage in riding which will endanger themselves or others. Riders must consult other riders before increasing pace and/or distance from the group on trail rides and other group activities.
- 11. When riding in groups the rider of the horse following is responsible for keeping his/her horse at a safe distance from the horse in front. A horse known to kick should have a red ribbon in its tail.
- 12. Horses must be in a condition fit to undertake the activities and riders are responsible for the condition and safety of their tack
- 13. Owners of stallions are to notify a Committee member that they are bringing a stallion to an activity day.
- 14. BRC Committee reserves the right to ask members to remove a horse which is being disruptive or is not sufficiently under control.
- 15. Dogs must be restrained and under control at all times.
- 16. Spectators should be at a safe distance from riding events.
- 17. Parents and carers must ensure children in their care are supervised and kept a safe distance from horses, vehicles and equipment.
- 18. Members are to act in accordance to the BRC Code of Conduct. The committee reserves the right to refuse participation of members in breach of the BRC Code of Conduct.

Primarily made up of oxers, there were two vertical fillers, with the second one being a "narrow" blue wave; which proved for a refusal by some. Day Two: Cross Country. Dan felt great and (surprisingly) was very relaxed in the warm up area. Even the horse bolting across grounds - having left the Cross country course prematurely, minus rider and half a bridle, didn't bother him?! Same again, a few minutes later, when a second riderless horse, returned earlier than expected?! In retrospect, perhaps I should have been "bothered", as it was something you don't often see in Newcomers?!. Anyway, aside from the water jump in front of the spectators area, the course "ran" backwards. Some of the jumps, can only be jumped one way eg. a ski jump - so for some parts of the course you had to turn a 180 loop back to go over the jump and then another again to continue along the course. This worked quite well, but some parts "rode" a bit choppy and made it difficult to get into a really forward momentum. Perhaps, more suited to smaller horses being at times a little "goat tracky", as having to come back to a trot. We started off with our usual "wobble" into the first 2 jumps and then we were away! It was a very "busy" course with lots to "see" and in the middle part of the course, we had 2 refusals which was disappointing; but the last part Dan rode very confidently as the course opened up for a couple of gallops between the fences. I was pleased overall with his progress on course especially his confidence between the fences (compared to last years comp where he "danced" along for half the course).

Anyway, with the additional 40 jump plus time penalties, we finished 23 out of 33 competitors.

Many thanks to Helen for organising the ride and this report.



Chris Chugg Clinic July 2009

My horse Nikita has been leased by 14yo Pony Club rider Mikaela Maisano since January this year. My pony Mo and I and Mikaela and Nikita have been out a bit over the last few weeks.

Chris Chugg Clinic Equestrian Park - This was run over 2 days in July. It was organise through ACT SJ club. Mikaelas class was last on the Saturday, the weather was beautiful and the setting on the good green going in a sheltered area was inspiring (wished I was riding) but I don't think Chris noticed as he had food poisoning. He soldiered on - the class started promptly with trot poles, and then a grid of 3 bounces and then on to course work. He was keen on the riders stopping in a straight line after the jump and then looking over their shoulder at the jump to check for straightness, turning the horses on their haunches and jumping back over the jump. He told a lot of the riders to SLOW DOWN, and some to CARRY THE HAND to have contact and not sit on the neck, but short reins. He was also keen on the riders to jump from a more forward seat than I have seen taught before. We were always taught to stay upright in front of the fence, unless you were 6' 3" with legs of steel so you could stay there if the horse stopped!! He put Mikaela's stirrups up another hole. Another exercise that I thought was good was to jump some of the jumps on the course again, by riding a 30ish metre circle – the jumps he picked were both the middle jumps of 3 jump unrelated lines. He worked on angles as well, on his cleverly set up course. He was very positive and got on with it, (wishing the day would end so he could recover I think!!) and Sunday was pretty much a repeat of Saturday, which for Nikita and Mikaela was very valuable to build confidence - Nikita can still balk at spooky jumps but is improving all the time. A worth while clinic that pushed us along a notch in their jumping progress, and was great to watch the more advance class too.

Berrima Cross Country Clinic 16th August 2009

My niece and I ventured back up to the beautiful property, "Araluen" for a very interesting day. The clinic had 3 parts including a practise Showiump course, a 2 hour Cross country lesson and a competition open flagged cross country course. This was a perfect event to challenge ourselves at the Intro level. It was my first round of an 80cm Showjump course on Dan. After 2 refusals at the first oxer, the Instructor took off the back rail and we got over it to then school it a couple of times, then with the rail back on to jump the whole the course perfectly. I was stoked! Next our XC lesson, starting with the tyres and then to the Woodstack (not a high jump but was quite wide) where things got pear shaped! A sudden and late refusal sent me flying over the jump without my horse!!!! Quite stunned, I got back on to complete the clinic, ending on a great note at the Prelim jump in/out at the water. But stiffening up afterwards, I decided not to attempt the XC comp course as felt that we were not confident enough to go round without issues and there were no smaller optional jumps. Later, I pondered as to the why? and it occurred to me that it was not the jump that was the issue, it was the white sand on the other side of the jump that "surprised" Dan hence the late refusal (it use to be jumped in reverse and the sand was there to stabilise the take off point in the past). In retrospect, we should have been more particular and "checked" the landing side beforehand and even have attempted it from the other side first. It was good learning curve and the clinic was a great chance to school the jumps without the pressures of an actual competition.

I was very pleased with the test and Sunny did some lovely canter work and we didn't make any mistakes with the new test – always a bonus.

Bungendore Riding Club Code of Conduct

- 1. Horse riding at Bungendore Riding Club activity days is restricted to financial members of the club or others who are otherwise covered by temporary insurance cover (e.g riders at ODE events)
- 2. Members are to follow the procedures set down by the BRC Event Organisers including making payments on time/by the due date as required.
- 3. Riders must wear approved AS/NZ 3838 or EFA approved helmet at all times whilst mounted. It must be structurally sound. Riders are encouraged to wear helmets at all other times when handling horses.
- 4. Suitable footwear which prevents the foot from sliding forward through the stirrup iron must be worn or caged stirrups must be used. Stirrups must be the correct size for the boot.
- 5. Suitable riding attire must be worn. It is recommended that riders wear full length trousers or jodhpurs and a sleeved shirt.
- 6. A first aid kit and communication link is to be available at Club activity days.
- 7. Members should not be under the influence of alcohol or drugs prohibited by law during an activity day.
- 8. Pregnant riders should be aware of the benefits and risks associated with riding in this condition and must obtain and act upon professional medical advice regarding their fitness to continue participating in equine activities.
- 9. Members are to participate in a polite, honest and respectful manner in dealings with fellow members, officials and others associated with BRC. Inappropriate behaviour and/or abusive language will not be tolerated. Members must accept responsibility for their actions.
- 10. Members are not to engage in riding which will endanger themselves or others. Riders must consult other riders before increasing pace and/or distance from the group on trail rides and other group activities.
- 11. When riding in groups the rider of the horse following is responsible for keeping his/her horse at a safe distance from the horse in front. A horse known to kick should have a red ribbon in its tail.
- 12. Horses must be in a condition fit to undertake the activities and riders are responsible for the condition and safety of their tack
- 13. Owners of stallions are to notify a Committee member that they are bringing a stallion to an activity day.
- 14. BRC Committee reserves the right to ask members to remove a horse which is being disruptive or is not sufficiently under control.
- 15. Dogs must be restrained and under control at all times.
- 16. Spectators should be at a safe distance from riding events.
- 17. Parents and carers must ensure children in their care are supervised and kept a safe distance from horses, vehicles and equipment.
- 18. Members are to act in accordance to the BRC Code of Conduct. The committee reserves the right to refuse participation of members in breach of the BRC Code of Conduct.

Beginners to a little more advanced, Amanda showed everyone how to ride the movements of a dressage test accurately and utilise the entire arena correctly so as to not throw away valuable marks in a test. It truly becomes the "art of a test". One could hear surprised comments from most riders at some stage as suddenly the penny dropped at how easy it really is but how difficult we had made it for ourselves. Amanda's other focus on better positioning of rider on the horse in order to allow the horse to travel more freely and happily was also a key point of reinforcement for all participants. Thank you to Amanda for sharing her lovely property with BRC members. There is talk of making this a regular "thing" every 2nd month or so...I'd encourage anyone to come along, learn heaps and ride better.

Bungendore Riding Club Code of Conduct

- 1. Horse riding at Bungendore Riding Club activity days is restricted to financial members of the club or others who are otherwise covered by temporary insurance cover (e.g riders at ODE events)
- 2. Members are to follow the procedures set down by the BRC Event Organisers including making payments on time/by the due date as required.
- 3. Riders must wear approved AS/NZ 3838 or EFA approved helmet at all times whilst mounted. It must be structurally sound. Riders are encouraged to wear helmets at all other times when handling horses.
- 4. Suitable footwear which prevents the foot from sliding forward through the stirrup iron must be worn or caged stirrups must be used. Stirrups must be the correct size for the boot.
- 5. Suitable riding attire must be worn. It is recommended that riders wear full length trousers or jodhpurs and a sleeved shirt.
- 6. A first aid kit and communication link is to be available at Club activity days.
- 7. Members should not be under the influence of alcohol or drugs prohibited by law during an activity day.
- 8. Pregnant riders should be aware of the benefits and risks associated with riding in this condition and must obtain and act upon professional medical advice regarding their fitness to continue participating in equine activities.
- 9. Members are to participate in a polite, honest and respectful manner in dealings with fellow members, officials and others associated with BRC. Inappropriate behaviour and/or abusive language will not be tolerated. Members must accept responsibility for their actions.
- 10. Members are not to engage in riding which will endanger themselves or others. Riders must consult other riders before increasing pace and/or distance from the group on trail rides and other group activities.
- 11. When riding in groups the rider of the horse following is responsible for keeping his/her horse at a safe distance from the horse in front. A horse known to kick should have a red ribbon in its tail.
- 12. Horses must be in a condition fit to undertake the activities and riders are responsible for the condition and safety of their tack
- 13. Owners of stallions are to notify a Committee member that they are bringing a stallion to an activity day.
- 14. BRC Committee reserves the right to ask members to remove a horse which is being disruptive or is not suffi-
- 15. Dogs must be restrained and under control at all times.
- 16. Spectators should be at a safe distance from riding events.
- 17. Parents and carers must ensure children in their care are supervised and kept a safe distance from horses, vehicles and equipment.
- 18. Members are to act in accordance to the BRC Code of Conduct. The committee reserves the right to refuse participation of members in breach of the BRC Code of Conduct.

Ahhh!! Spring is finally here. After a long, wet winter I bet you are all cheering up... The birds are singing, the days are warmer and longer, the grass is growing and our paddocks are looking lush and green.

But... have you noticed your four legged, horsey friends are also feeling pretty good within themselves? Rides might present new challenges as they develop their Spring spring!!

If our horses were running free (and yes, surviving without rugs, hand feeding and all of our love) they would be pretty poor coming out of winter so Mother Nature produces excellent feed to bring them back into condition, ready for breeding and the approaching dry summer. Unfortunately, due to our insistence on keeping them well fed during winter, they don't need the excessive sugar content that spring pasture offers to them.

BE WARNED!! Not only will they bounce around like kids on red lollies - your horse may be in danger...

Winter grasses that are boosted in growth by warmer, early and wet Spring condition after rain, with cool nights often beand warm days, come lush and highly productive. Lush pasture, especially ryegrass, phalaris and fescue dominant pastures, are considered high risk pastures, as well as succulent, rapidly growing clover in pastures in early

Spring. These grasses are able to accumulate large amounts of nonstructural carbohydrates in the form of fructans and other simple sugars. Under cold overnight and early morning conditions, these sugars are not transferred into the plant stems for growth.

These sugars can lead to your horse foundering (laminitis). There is a wealth of information available on the Internet and in horse books about laminitis and the dangers to your horse both immediately and into the future (a horse that develops laminitis is more prone to laminitis again in the future).



A foundered horse is reluctant to move, and often leans back in an attempt to take weight off the front of the hooves. The pain is such that the horse often prefers to lay down. There is generally a palpable increase in the pulse to the



RIDING CLUB hooves, pain on compression of the sole and often the horse's weight is shifted from one limb to the other. As soon as a horse is suspected of having foundered Veterinary attention or advice should be sought.

There are many treatments available. The most important initially is to remove or treat the cause. Restrict access to lush spring pastures to 1 ½ hours in the early to midmorning to 10 am, and again in the mid to late afternoon, as the peak production of fructan sugars in the leaves of plants synthesised by sunlight photosynthesis occurs over the late morning to mid afternoon period.



If you aren't able to separate your horse from its pasture, consider purchasing a grazing muzzle to limit the amount of pasture your horse can consume whilst also eliminating stress and anxiety that could be experienced if the horse was separated from its paddock mates.

BRC Code of Conduct

- 1. Horse riding at Bungendore Riding Club activity days is restricted to financial members of the club or others who are otherwise covered by temporary insurance cover (e.g riders at ODE events)
- 2. Members are to follow the procedures set down by the BRC Event Organisers including making payments on time/by the due date as required.
- 3. Riders must wear approved AS/NZ 3838 or EFA approved helmet at all times whilst mounted. It must be structurally sound. Riders are encouraged to wear helmets at all other times when handling horses.
- 4. Suitable footwear which prevents the foot from sliding forward through the stirrup iron must be worn or caged stirrups must be used. Stirrups must be the correct size for the boot.
- 5. Suitable riding attire must be worn. It is recommended that riders wear full length trousers or jodhpurs and a sleeved shirt.
- 6. A first aid kit and communication link is to be available at Club activity days.
- 7. Members should not be under the influence of alcohol or drugs prohibited by law during an activity day.
- 8. Pregnant riders should be aware of the benefits and risks associated with riding in this condition and must obtain and act upon professional medical advice regarding their fitness to continue participating in equine activities
- 9. Members are to participate in a polite, honest and respectful manner in dealings with fellow members, officials and others associated with BRC. Inappropriate behaviour and/or abusive language will not be tolerated. Members must accept responsibility for their actions.
- 10. Members are not to engage in riding which will endanger themselves or others. Riders must consult other riders before increasing pace and/or distance from the group on trail rides and other group activities.
- 11. When riding in groups the rider of the horse following is responsible for keeping his/her horse at a safe distance from the horse in front. A horse known to kick should have a red ribbon in its tail.
- 12. Horses must be in a condition fit to undertake the activities and riders are responsible for the condition and safety of their tack
- 13. Owners of stallions are to notify a Committee member that they are bringing a stallion to an activity day.
- 14. BRC Committee reserves the right to ask members to remove a horse which is being disruptive or is not sufficiently under control.
- 15. Dogs must be restrained and under control at all times.
- 16. Spectators should be at a safe distance from riding events.
- 17. Parents and carers must ensure children in their care are supervised and kept a safe distance from horses, vehicles and equipment.
- 18. Members are to act in accordance to the BRC Code of Conduct. The committee reserves the right to refuse participation of members in breach of the BRC Code of Conduct.

Riding Background:

Plaiting up Sunny for the first time I had no idea what I was doing and I don't think Sunny was very impressed with the result. Sadly I haven't improved that much yet.


Nearly coming off a couple of times in the Jamie Grant clinic not so funny for me, but I'm sure it looked hilarious.

Bungendore Riding Club exists purely through the devotion and hard work of the unpaid volunteers within the club.

Each and every event, clinic and rally day we hold requires a lot of background work such as organising instructors / judges, taking entries, scheduling classes, catering and most importantly setting up and packing

Too many times it's the same people who give up their time away from their families and horses to make these things happen.

For example, our ODE is our biggest fund raiser each year - the club would struggle to continue without the income it generates - yet sadly, there were very few people who were prepared to assist with the setting up and packing away of the equipment. What should have taken an hour to setup took over 4 hours.

When we ask for helpers we really mean it - even if you aren't riding on the day, your assistance will always be appreciated. Many hands make light work - this is YOUR club so PLEASE find that hour to spare when we ask for your help!.

SNAKEbite



hot weather upon us. our slitherv mates the snakes

are out in force. Here's some advice to hopefully help you if you find your horse has been bitten:

Rule number one: NO panicking! Horses have a good chance of survival if bitten by a snake, as they are large in size, meaning that it would take much more venom to kill a horse than it would a human. and snakes are said to have a conscious choice as to whether or not to just bite the victim, or to bite and inject venom.

Apparently, more often than not, snakes do not bite to kill horses. more to warn them off, and therefore, on occasion, no venom is injected.

If you have found your horse with a swollen bite site that you think may be related to a snakebite, call your vet IMMEDIATELY. If you've seen the snake, then that's even better, you know for sure what caused the bite.

Next, try to establish where your

horse has been bitten, most commonly this is on the muzzle, as a horse will have lowered his head to get a good look at the thing slithering beneath his nose. The biggest danger with these bites is that the muzzle swells so much that it makes breathing difficult or impossible for the horse. In this case, carrying two lengths of flexible but strong garden hose (each approx 6 inches long) may save your equine friend's life. The pieces of hose can be lubricated (with vaseline or similar product) and inserted into each nostril to keep the swelling from cutting off your horse's airways. This will buy you some time for the vet to arrive. As with a human victim, keep your horse quiet, and do not nove him more than necessary. If you need to take him home, get a float out to where the bite occured and float him home.

It is important to get treatment for your horse, as sometimes antivenom may not be the best answer. Some horses also can go into shock, and so may require further attention. veterinary (Source: http://www.horserides.org/horsesandsnakebites.html)



BRC Code of Conduct

- 1. Horse riding at Bungendore Riding Club activity days is restricted to financial members of the club or others who are otherwise covered by temporary insurance cover (e.g riders at ODE events)
- 2. Members are to follow the procedures set down by the BRC Event Organisers including making payments on time/by the due date as required.
- 3. Riders must wear approved AS/NZ 3838 or EFA approved helmet at all times whilst mounted. It must be structurally sound. Riders are encouraged to wear helmets at all other times when handling horses.
- 4. Suitable footwear which prevents the foot from sliding forward through the stirrup iron must be worn or caged stirrups must be used. Stirrups must be the correct size for the boot.
- 5. Suitable riding attire must be worn. It is recommended that riders wear full length trousers or jodhpurs and a sleeved shirt.
- 6. A first aid kit and communication link is to be available at Club activity days.
- 7. Members should not be under the influence of alcohol or drugs prohibited by law during an activity day.
- 8. Pregnant riders should be aware of the benefits and risks associated with riding in this condition and must obtain and act upon professional medical advice regarding their fitness to continue participating in equine activi-
- 9. Members are to participate in a polite, honest and respectful manner in dealings with fellow members, officials and others associated with BRC. Inappropriate behaviour and/or abusive language will not be tolerated. Members must accept responsibility for their actions.
- 10. Members are not to engage in riding which will endanger themselves or others. Riders must consult other riders before increasing pace and/or distance from the group on trail rides and other group activities.
- 11. When riding in groups the rider of the horse following is responsible for keeping his/her horse at a safe distance from the horse in front. A horse known to kick should have a red ribbon in its tail.
- 12. Horses must be in a condition fit to undertake the activities and riders are responsible for the condition and safety of their tack
- 13. Owners of stallions are to notify a Committee member that they are bringing a stallion to an activity day.
- 14. BRC Committee reserves the right to ask members to remove a horse which is being disruptive or is not sufficiently under control.
- 15. Dogs must be restrained and under control at all times.
- 16. Spectators should be at a safe distance from riding events.
- 17. Parents and carers must ensure children in their care are supervised and kept a safe distance from horses, vehicles and equipment.
- 18. Members are to act in accordance to the BRC Code of Conduct. The committee reserves the right to refuse participation of members in breach of the BRC Code of Conduct.
