We want our members to benefit from our grounds and our equipment, so ... please join us for Pop-up Jump Club No 2 ☺ Poles and Cavaletti. We will have 3-4 stations in the arena with different combinations of poles and/or cavaletti set up for you to try out. You can do as much or as little as you like in your time slot depending on your horses' fitness.

Rego is **\$10** per horse. (If you bring more than 1 horse then please enter each horse separately). Rego via the website, as normal – Rego will close Wednesday 7th April.

For this activity we will be decorating the arena with poles and cavaletti! We'll have groups of 4 horses at a time in the arena with an hour to free play using what is set up. While there is no formal instruction on the day there will be someone at the arena to describe how each exercise can be ridden, maybe demo it on foot (or their horse) and to pole pick. Then if there is time at the end of the group sessions and you'd like to do a little more or experiment with a slightly different set up we will do our best to accommodate - hopefully we can all share some ideas and experiences with each other.

This is in addition to and separate from the **Kerry Masterman** clinic.

Of course you may enter both, but please be mindful of the timings and the fitness level of your horse. Kerry's lessons will not be held up because you are jumping!

PLEASE BRING YOUR OWN LUNCH, SNACKS and DRINKS – we'll open the clubhouse and have the fridge turned on if you need it. There is also a microwave for reheating Saturday night leftovers.
(We may also do a Zimi's pizza run on the day).

If you are riding, you will be required to wear an approved riding helmet (ASNZS 3838) or other approved by the EA (Equestrian Australia) and appropriate clothing and footwear. A separate waiver form may be required to fulfil the insurance obligations of the instructor.



BRC is an EA affiliated club and, as such, is covered by Public Liability Insurance. EA members are also covered under insurance whilst riding and training their horses. However, being a BRC member only does not mean that you are automatically covered under insurance. You should consider if holding your own personal accident or loss of income insurance is right for you if you are not also an EA member.
