**WEEKEND AWAY RIDE
@ BUMBLEBROOK COTTAGE, CANDELO**

This will be a relaxed weekend of easy trail riding suitable for horses that are not currently super fit

Bumblebrook:



Bumblebrook farm is situated a few kilometres from the township of Candelo on the South Coast. It is approximately a [3 hour drive](#) from Bungendore via Cooma and Nimmitabel. There is a great bakery and café in Nimmitabel – perfect for a brunch stop on your way to Candelo, too.

After leaving Nimmitabel, you head down Brown Mountain to Bemboka and from there it is an easy and scenic drive to Bumblebrook Farm.

***Brown Mountain does have twists and turns and some hairpin bends (though it is a good road) so please make sure your horse travels well and your float and vehicle are in good order.*

Friday will be a travel day and then a short stroll around the Bumblebrook 100 acre property, which has a lovely creek/river to relax by with afternoon tea. If the weather is warm a swim or paddle will also be very nice! Dinner will be at the farm using their lovely large covered BBQ area. *Please bring your own meat and a salad to share.*

Please ensure that your gear/equipment/horse/pony is in good safe working order. If you are riding, you will be required to wear a riding helmet approved by EA (Equestrian Australia) and appropriate clothing and footwear.

BRC is an EA affiliated club and, as such, is covered by Public Liability Insurance. EA members are also covered under insurance whilst riding and training their horses. However, being a BRC member only does not mean that you are automatically covered under insurance. You should consider if holding your own personal accident or loss of income insurance is right for you if you are not also an EA member.

On **Saturday** we will float the horses approx. 45 minutes to the coast to the [Bournda National Park](#) for a short ride and a laze at the beautiful lagoon there. (An \$8 per vehicle park entry fee applies) Swimming is an option once again. Saturday night will be dinner at the Candelo Pub.

Sunday has a few riding options so the group will discuss this day's ride on the weekend and decide together.

Accommodation



The accommodation at Bumblebrook consists of 4 self-contained units all joined together. BRC has secured 3 of these units.



All the units have a small balcony and stunning views across the farm and to the hills in the distance. Two units are studio style and have one queen bed and two units have a separate bedroom with 3 beds. Linen is included.

Breakfast for one morning (or two if you don't eat a lot 😊) of eggs, bacon, bread, pod coffee and tea is included. Also provided is juice, milk, butter and jam, salt and pepper.

There are two large well fenced paddocks (with water) for the horses and an area to park the floats.

Cost is \$170 per person for the weekend which includes the nightly horse fee.

Registrations open 6 February and close 13 March – unless filled earlier...
